

1. Journal Article

Example:

T. L. Ward, R. R. Bererito, R. J. Berni, and D. M. Soignet, *Text. Res. J.*, **43**, 646 (1973).

Explanation :

For journal articles, list the authors in the order of last name followed by initials, separating multiple authors with commas and using “and” before the last author. Then provide the abbreviated journal name in italics, followed by the volume number in bold, the starting page, and the publication year in parentheses. Each part should be separated by commas, and the entry should end with a period.

2. Book

Example:

H. Corte, *“Handbook of Paper Science”*, Vol. 2 (H. F. Rance, Ed.), Elsevier, New York, p.175 (1982).

Explanation (English):

For books, begin with the author’s name (last name followed by initials), then provide the book title in italics. If applicable, include the volume number using “Vol.”. Editor names are included in parentheses with “Ed.” (or “Eds.” for multiple editors). Next, state the publisher’s name, place of publication, the specific page referenced (using “p.”), and the publication year in parentheses. Separate each element with commas, and end with a period.
